Introduction

This brief presentation will take us through some metered mail sent from various companies to Samuelsohn Limited, a maker of quality menswear since 1923.

- Ten covers, covering nine meters and, three meter types will be shown.
- ▶ The covers are presented in order of the date they were sent.

Cover 1 - May 23, 1947

International Meter Stamp Catalogue No. D3.B

Cover from Tuckers of Frome franked with 4, 6d meter impressions paying the 2/ airmail rate for a 1 ounce letter.

Cover 1 - May 23, 1947

- The manual positioning of the envelope to receive the 4 different meter impressions is off significantly.
- ► Heavy inking and reveals the bottom edge of the Die Head ≈ 3mm below the impressions.

A cover sent by Kaye & Stewart Ltd. franked with 1/3d stamps covering the $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce airmail rate to Canada in place between 1952 and 1965.

Cover 2 - May 2, 1955

- ▶ The 3d stamp appears to be double printed.
- On the 1/ meter impression the value die is offset 1mm below the rest of the stamp.

• The die edge is visible \approx 3mm below the stamp.

Cover from T. & M. Bairstow, Limited with a 3/9d stamp covering the $1\frac{1}{2}$ ounce airmail rate to Canada.

Cover 3 - Aug. 12, 1955

319 12 VIII 55 7 1

- The meter stamp is clear with no signs of over inking
- The Customs receiving stamp demonstrates a transit time of 3 days across the "Pond".

Cover 4 - Aug. 15, 1955

Cover sent from Standeven & Co Limited with a $2\frac{1}{2}d$ stamp paying the surface mail rate for 8 ounces.



Neopost, Meter Number 34 - Cancelled August 15, 1955 - Halifax, Yorkshire

Cover 4 - Aug. 15, 1955

- The right edge of the meter stamp appears thinner then the left
- ▶ The town mark isn't as skewed as the slogan or meter stamp.

Cover 5 - Sept. 16, 1955

- Clear impressions for the most part.
- ▶ Possible sign of under inking or damage to the die at the top.

Cover sent from Dobroyd Limited with a 1/ and a 3d meter stamp to pay the $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce airmail rate to Canada.

Cover 6 - May 8, 1956

Neopost International Meter Stamp Catalogue No. D3.B



- ▶ Nice to have a meter stamp with the meter number "1".
- The two meter stamps are $\approx \frac{1}{2}$ mm apart.
- Poor inking on the top of the die.
- On the left meter stamp the "Great" of Great Britain is missing.

Light inking.

- The die appears to be damaged/bend towards the left on the bottom right by the meter number.
- ▶ Other examples of this Meter don't show the same "bending".

- Inking has improved from cover 2.
- The right meter stamp's value die is still offset 1mm below the rest of the stamp.
- The meter stamps appear to narrow at the bottom right as a result of excess ink.

- ▶ I like the simple design.
- Conmhagh translates to "hound-plain".
- There are 6 dots/dashes that pass through the meter stamp vertically roughly through the centre.
